## Conference overview

This four-day virtual course is an extensive review of multiple systems in anatomic pathology that will allow anatomic pathologists to become more proficient in different fields of pathology. The didactic presentations from leading national experts in the field of pathology will provide in-depth discussions of problems in diagnoses that practicing pathologists face in their hospitals in day-to-day activities, while the seminar will help residents and fellows with their specialty boards.

## Intended audience

This seminar is intended primarily for practicing pathologists, fellows, residents, and other health care professionals.

## Conference objectives

At the conclusion of this seminar, participants should be able to:

- Demonstrate improvement in diagnostic skill in problematic areas of anatomical pathology.
- Identify, classify, and differentiate benign, premalignant, and malignant lesions in different organs.
- Apply special immunostains and molecular testing in the evaluation of non-neoplastic and neoplastic diseases.
- Communicate results effectively with the clinicians and better appreciate the importance of clinicopathologic correlation.
