## Conference Overview

With the rapid changes in practice patterns and new evidence in the literature, it is imperative that the OB-GYN generalist and family medicine physician stay up to date on several key topics in general obstetrics, obstetrical emergencies, medical complications of pregnancy, gynecology and gynecologic oncology.
