Steven R. DeMeester, M.D. earned his medical degree from Loyola Stritch School of Medicine, and subsequently completed both a general surgery residency and critical care fellowship at the University of Michigan. He then went on to complete cardiothoracic surgery training, with special emphasis on general thoracic surgery, at Barnes Hospital, Washington University in St. Louis. Following a one-year esophageal surgery fellowship at at the University of Southern California he joined the faculty and ultimately achieved the rank of Full Professor and Clinical Scholar. In 2016 after nearly 20 years at USC he left to go into private practice in the Oregon Clinic in Portland Oregon where he became Clinical Professor of Surgery at Oregon Health and Sciences University. He currently serves as President and Executive Director of Foundation for Education and Research in Esophageal and Foregut Disease, Inc. He has more than 200 peer reviewed publications and has served on the editorial boards of Annals of Surgery, Annals of Thoracic Surgery and Diseases of the Esophagus. He has mentored numerous surgeons worldwide and is an active participant in international surgical societies and education initiatives.
