

The course is intended for advanced clinicians (physicians, nurses, pharmacists, and allied health care professionals) who practice classic hematology, medical oncology, radiation oncology, surgical oncology, and/or stem cell/cellular therapy.

In this course, clinicians will:

- Discuss classic hematological disorders.

- Explain porphyrias and the various types and classifications.
- Develop knowledge and skills to optimize care for patients with classic hematological conditions.
