## Overview and intended audience

This course will cover new developments in the diagnosis and treatment of malignant and nonmalignant hematological disorders, as presented at the 2025 Annual Meeting of the American Society of Hematology (ASH). Faculty will share the latest updates in myeloid malignancies, lymphoma, leukemia, multiple myeloma, coagulation disorders, and stem cell transplantation. Attendees will gain a deeper understanding of emerging treatments for hematological malignancies and blood disorders, and learn how these new therapies can be integrated into daily practice. This conference is intended for primary care physicians, hematologists, medical oncologists, fellows, residents, CRNPs, PAs, nurses, and all other health care providers.

## Objectives

- Discuss the cutting-edge data presented at the 2025 Annual Meeting of the American Society of Hematology.
- Identify updates in molecular abnormalities which can be utilized in the diagnosis, prognosis, risk stratification, and therapy selection for patients with myeloid malignancies.
- Describe the relevant clinical trial data in clinical practice which has the potential to improve outcomes in patients with malignant hematologic disorders including non-Hodgkin's lymphoma, CLL, and multiple myeloma.
- Review the updates in sequencing strategies in the era of novel immunotherapies, CAR-T, targeted therapies, and stem cell transplantation.
- Discuss the latest advances in coagulation and platelet disorders.
