

## Biography

### Guilherme M Campos MD PhD FASMBS FACS

Guilherme M. Campos, M.D., Ph.D. earned his medical degree and Ph.D. in surgery from the Federal University of Paraná in Brazil. After moving to the United States in 1997, he completed fellowships in advanced laparoscopic surgery and foregut surgery at the University of Southern California, followed by general surgery residency at LAC+USC Medical Center. He then joined the faculty at the University of California San Francisco, where he served as Assistant Professor of Surgery and Director of the UCSF Bariatric Surgery Center. He later moved to the University of Wisconsin, where he was promoted to Professor of Surgery and served as Director of the MIS and Advanced GI Surgery Fellowship. In 2015, he joined Virginia Commonwealth University, where he holds the Paul J. Nutter Professorship of Surgery and serves as Chair of the Division of Bariatric and Gastrointestinal Surgery, Director of the VCU Bariatric Surgery Program, and Co-Director of the Foregut, Advanced GI/MIS and Bariatric Fellowship. Dr. Campos has authored more than 140 peer-reviewed publications and book chapters and has served in editorial leadership roles for SOARD, the Journal of Gastrointestinal Surgery, and Foregut.
